

How many fiber optic cores are needed for a repeater



Overview

A simple rule is that each device needs two cores—one for sending and one for receiving data. The number of optical cores in an optical fiber is the total number of equipment interfaces multiplied by 2, plus 10% to 20% of the spare quantity, and if the communication mode of the equipment has serial communication and equipment multiplexing, you can reduce the number of cores. For example, the total number of cores in an MTP®-8 trunk cable equals 4 (number of branches) x 8 (MTP-8).
