Enterprise LANs use the RJ45 port on 100/1000BASE switches. It connects access layer devices and uplinks from desktop switches or directly to end devices. RJ45 ports serve access-layer copper connections; SFP/SFP+ ports enable flexible 1G/10G uplinks; SFP28 delivers 25G for modern data centers; QSFP+ and QSFP28 support high-density 40G/100G spine-leaf.
