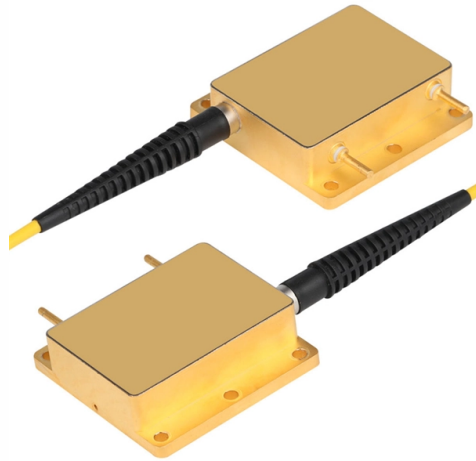


What size should the clamp head of the junction box be



Overview

The size of the clamp should match the size of the knockout hole in the breaker box. Standard sizes include 1/2", 3/4", 1", 1-1/4", and 1-1/2" inches. Rule of Thumb for Selection: For a standard switch using 14 AWG wire, an 18 in³ PVC box is typically adequate. 5 in³ deep PVC box or a 4" square metal box with a mud ring to ensure a proper fit without compressing. These are among the most versatile and commonly used junction box sizes in residential and commercial wiring in the United States. Typically available in depths ranging from 1-1/2 inches to 2-1/8 inches, their square shape provides ample internal volume for making multiple wire connections and.
